


HIV Impact Network for Vertical Transmission Elimination




Where do we stand?

Incidence: 1.3 million people acquired HIVworldwide in 2023 including 120 000 children (<15 years)




Where are the children LWHIV ?




87% of children living with HIVare in Sub-Saharan Africa


New HIV infections in babies by cause of transmission 2023


Impact of funding cuts and program disruptions



- Lower rates of testing in prevention of vertical transmission programs
- Disproportionate stock outs of paediatric ARV formulations
- Cessation of community led support services for vertical transmission and paediatric care and support

Impact of funding cuts and program disruptions

If the former PEPFAR programmes are not continued, by 2030 there could be:

- 660,000 new HIV infections among children
- 260,000 thousand additional AIDS deaths among children
- 3.4 million more AIDS orphans




